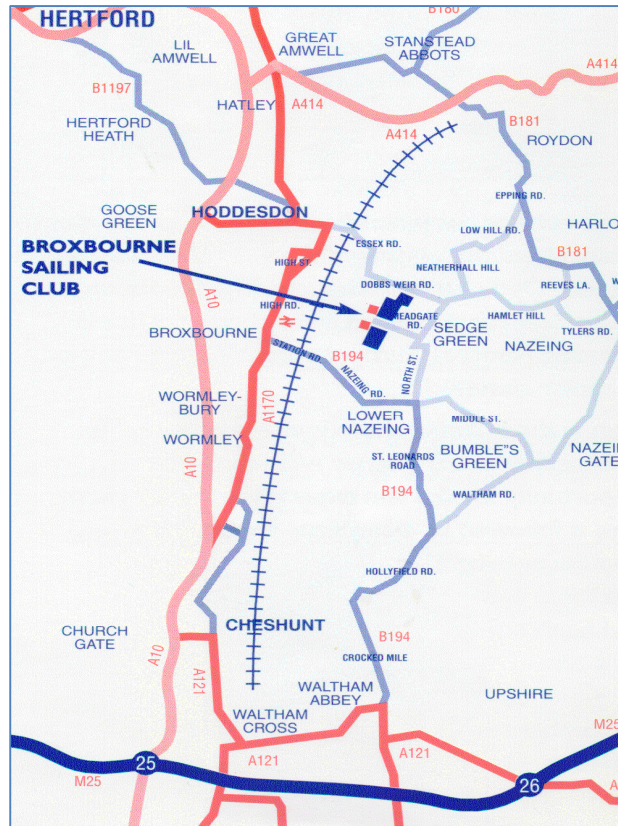
Youth sailors progressively become more involved in the clubs racing and other activities as their skills and confidence improves.

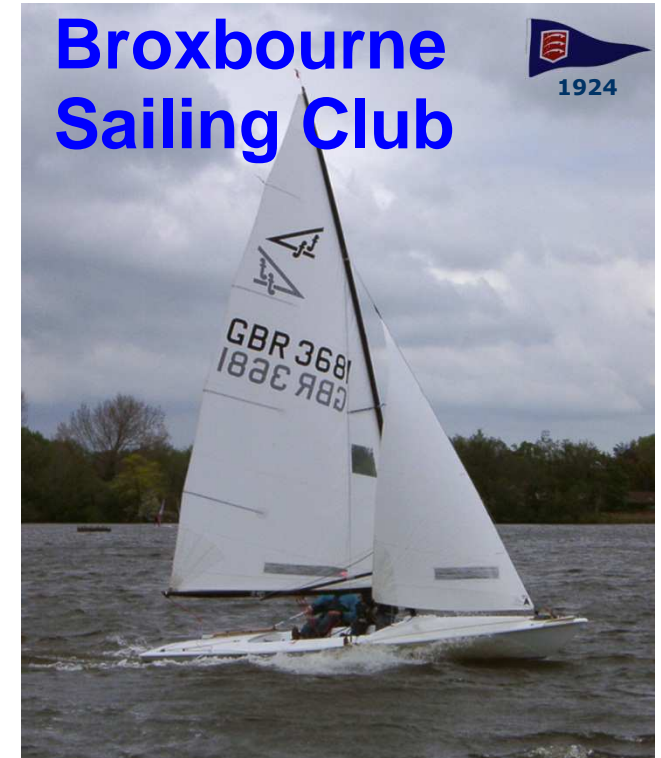

Welcome to our Club

Broxbourne Sailing Club provides safe lake sailing, all year round, for all abilities from beginners to world class. Our lake is in pleasant setting within the Lea Valley and is easy to get to from North London, Hertfordshire and Essex.

We are a club where all members join in and assist with running and maintaining the club and its activities. To this end support and training is available to help the less experienced learn to run races, training sessions and man the safety boat.

Facilities

Our brand new purpose built clubhouse with large club room and bar supports an active social side to the club as well as providing changing rooms, and a kitchen.



Outside the clubhouse is a paved picnic and barbeque area for the family to enjoy on a summer afternoon or evening.

There is very good provision of pontoons which make for easy landing and mooring in any wind direction.



Boat storage is within a large, grassed dinghy compound close to the water and enclosed by a locked security fence.

Launching is available via three slipways. An electric jib crane is used for launching flying fifteen and K1 keelboats.



The lake has been dredged allowing all the area to be used. Water level is controlled via sluices and maintains a nearly constant level irrespective of droughts or deluges. There is a continuous flow of fresh water which to date has ensured that we never have a weed problem unlike some other local lakes.

- Saturday – Learning to sail, training and informal racing
- Sundays - Main Class and Handicap Racing, generally with committee boat starts
- Wednesday Eve (Summer) - Less formal racing and Barbeque
- Cruising and Windsurfing – Any time for competent sailors except during Sunday racing.

The largest classes within the club are the International Flying Fifteen, Phantom, Streaker, Laser, Topper and the recently introduced K1 keelboat.

We welcome any mono-hull dinghy into our handicap fleet.

Learning to Sail and Training

Both formal and informal coaching is available for club members.

In addition the club is the base for the East London Windsurfing School and Broxbourne Watersports and Sailing Centre (BWSC) both of which are RYA recognised training establishments.



Both organisations offer formal tuition from absolute beginner to advanced level for both adults and children.
