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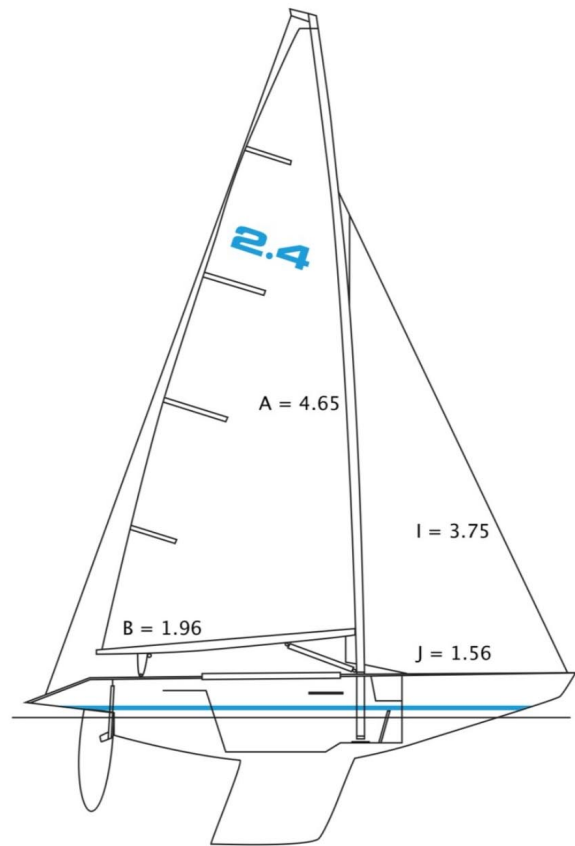

The 2.4mR is a one-person keelboat that offers even the most accomplished competitive sailors a unique opportunity to test their sailing skills. As complex and challenging as an Etchells or a Dragon without the high costs and need for a crew.



All the controls are within easy reach and the boat can be steered with feet or hands therefore neither size nor fitness level have an impact on speed. Crew weight also has little significance as one sits near the centre of gravity over the keel. Layouts are optional allowing freedom to experiment and diversity is often the norm allowing even the less able to race competitively.



$$\frac{L+2d-F+\sqrt{s}}{2.37} = \underline{\underline{2.4}}$$

- L = Corrected Length
- D = Midship Girth Difference
- F = Average Freeboard Height
- S = Total Sail Area

Originally based on the metre rule, the 2.4mR has been perfected by Peter Norlin whose latest hull designs are now used by about 90% of the racing fleet.



Weighing around 254kg all up, the boat can be easily trailed with a normal car and launched either by crane or down a slipway.

The largest UK fleet is currently at Frensham Pond and regular open events are held at various UK and worldwide venues with the 2024 World Championships at Keile in Germany.
